Included within the corridor are many public lands such as the Ocala National Forest, Juniper Springs Wilderness Area, Silver River State Park, the Cross Florida Greenway, Florida National Scenic Trail, Lake George and Tiger Bay State Forests. We invite you to travel the Byway and enjoy the many intrinsic resources.

The goals of the Florida Black Bear Scenic Byway Corridor Management Entity include installation of wildlife crossings, construction of informational kiosks and interpretive areas, and applying for status as a National Scenic Byway. Among the benefits of the byway are reduced human and wildlife fatalities, improved habitat connectivity and providing economic opportunities for local residents within the corridor by encouraging sustainable economic development programs.
